



Donor Bill of Rights

GoggleWorks Center for the Arts (GoggleWorks) is committed to earning and keeping donor confidence, trust and respect. To assure that philanthropy merits the respect and trust of the general public, and that donors and prospective donors can have full confidence in the not-for-profit organizations and causes they are asked to support, GoggleWorks upholds the following donor rights:

- I. To be informed of the mission of GoggleWorks, the way resources will be used and their capacity to use donations for their intended purposes.
- II. To be informed of the identity of those serving on GoggleWorks' governing board and to expect the board to exercise prudent judgment in its stewardship responsibilities.
- III. To have access to GoggleWorks' most recent financial statements.
- IV. To be assured their gifts will be used for the purposes for which they were given.
- V. To receive an appropriate acknowledgement, recognition and tax receipt.
- VI. To be assured that information about their donations is handled with respect and with confidentiality to the extent provided by the law.
- VII. To expect that all relationships with individuals representing GoggleWorks will be professional in nature.
- VIII. To be informed whether those seeking donations are volunteers, employees of GoggleWorks or hired solicitors.
- IX. To have the opportunity for their names be deleted from mailing lists that Imagine may intend to share.
- X. To feel free to ask questions when making a donation and to receive prompt, truthful and forthright answers.
